CASE STUDY:

Akmol Hussain is a housing inspector in Barking and Dagenham Council's Private Sector Housing team. To support his career development, he is undertaking an Environmental Health Practitioner Apprenticeship which will allow him to register as a Chartered Environmental Health Practitioner. Talking about why he chose the apprenticeship route, Akmol said,

"to gain work experience while earning a degree and position myself well for employment. This choice, fully funded with a salary, eliminates the need for a student loan, creating a win-win situation".





Building a pipeline of skills in health, education, social work, social care and policing for London

We are integral to the delivery of public services across London and we work in partnership to best support and serve our local communities.

Every year we train:

Our students undertake **5,000** nursing and midwifery placements, supporting 18 NHS Trusts across London.

We are a founding member of the Healthcare Education Consortium,

a group of seven universities and NHS Trusts co-designing training programmes and tackling staff shortages.

Our **£23M** virtual hospital at Saracens Rugby Club StoneX Stadium has cutting edge simulation-based skills facilities to train nurses and midwives for emergency care. Our academics support local schools to train T-Level Midwifery students and, with the NHS North Central London Training Hub, we host an annual health and social care careers fair for over 300 students.

Our award-winning partnership with the North Central London Integrated Care System delivers professional training to adult social care nurses and supports student placements.

Through the Police Education Consortium, we have **helped train over 3,000 Police Officers**.

CASE STUDY:



Manolo Bilog is an NHS nurse practising at Hampstead's Royal Free Hospital. After training in the Philippines, Manolo studied on Middlesex University's transition programme for overseas qualified nurses. He now supports new learners as an education nurse and has returned to Middlesex to study for a Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education.

Educating local people to improve their wellbeing and career opportunities

We are proud to help people in our community access graduate level work and careers so they can achieve more and feel happier throughout their lives.

Middlesex guarantees places and interviews for all Barnet students who meet our entry criteria.

We host 77 school visits and work with 17,339 students in 115 local schools and colleges every year. Supporting them to plan their next steps in higher education, apprenticeships and other routes.

We **provide careers education and interview workshops** for local school and college students and review over 550 Personal Statements for university applications every year. Our annual **STEM festival attracts over 500 students** from across London to learn more about the opportunities these subjects offer.



Working with partners to make **our region a safe, welcoming and inspiring place**



Every year the University hosts thousands of people from the local community at interfaith celebrations, public lectures, performances, business breakfasts, exhibitions and public celebrations.

The University has a Biodiversity Action Plan developed with London Wildlife Trust, with 140,000 bees and 110m2 of green wall on campus suited to location and climate.

CASE STUDY:

Reimagining disused community spaces

The **Kilburn Lab** initiative, led by the School of Arts and supported by the London Boroughs of Brent and Camden, reimagines disused community spaces to improve North London neighbourhoods through 44 major projects run by our creative students. Our Interior Architecture and Design students support community groups to develop their spaces



and built a scale model of Kilburn High Street to assist with a Local Authority consultation exercise. This has helped local people, community organisations and businesses have a say over the strategic direction of high streets. Our students also curated the Kilburn Museum Lab, to celebrate the area's hidden stories and people's wishes for the future of Kilburn.
